SATs week

This Year the pupils in Year 6 will take their Standard Attainment Tests (SATs) on the following dates. If you have a pupil in Year 6 then please remember the dates and ensure that your child arrives at school promptly.

Mon Reading test

9 May

Tues10 May Grammar test followed by:

Spelling Test

Weds 11 May Maths Paper 1 (arithmetic)

followed by

Maths Paper 2 (reasoning)

Thurs 12 May Maths Paper 3 (reasoning)

The SATs are important as they are used to gauge progress from Year 6 to Year 11 (GCSE year). Ear rings

Time off school table

Each term we have to complete a census which is reported to the Department for Education. The census records a huge range of data including the attendance rate of pupils. I am delighted to report that we are on track for a new school record. However we do have a small number of children who have worrying attendance rates where we have not been made aware of a good reason for this. The table below shows the amount of time that a child (starting in Reception and finishing in Year 6) will miss at Isaac Newton based on their percentage of attendance.
