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#### Dear Parents/Carers

## Arriving and leaving school

Due to the on-going building work we will need to continue to use the same system as last year when dropping children off and picking them up from school. This is extremely frustrating but is unavoidable until the classrooms have been completed. As such children should be dropped off and picked up as follows:

**Year R:** Parents/Carers should take their children to the foundation stage play area at the back of school – this is the way in which you entered on your taster days.

Year 1 and 2: Parents/Carers should take their children to the main playground at the rear of the school – the teachers will meet the children there and bring them out to this playground at the end of the day.

**Years 3-6**: All children in these year groups will be collected from the area next to the basketball post.

## Labelling School Uniform and PE kit

At the start of the school year many pupils have **new uniform and P.E. kit**. It is essential that all school clothing is **labelled** with the pupil's **full name**. It becomes almost impossible to track down lost clothing if a name label is not present.

#### Attendance

As a school we are desperate to ensure that all pupils fulfil their potential. attendance of pupils forms a hugely important part of their ability to do well at school and as such will become a major focus in the coming year. On average, pupils who have attendance at less than 90% are missing 1 day every two weeks. This amounts to almost 4 weeks of time out of school. As a school we have a responsibility to ensure that attendance is good. As such Parents/Carers of pupils who fall below the 90% by the end of September will receive a phone call to inform them that this is the This will then give pupils the opportunity to improve their attendance levels. This should not cause concern for any parents where pupils have been ill for extended periods as we will already be aware of your circumstances.
